

Example:

Situation: Assessors in Florida want to identify property owners who are under-paying taxes by declaring multiple homestead exemptions. They suspect one group of owners may have taken single property tax deductions against several rental properties across county lines in Florida; and another group of owners claims exemptions for both their Florida vacation homes and their family homes in New York.


Solution: Exemption monitoring accesses hundreds of public and proprietary data sources to develop a dataset from which an algorithm identifies unusual results meriting additional examination. In the example situation, public deed and property tax information in New York are considered against county tax rolls in Florida to generate a list of property owners who appear to be claiming a homestead exemption. Additional filters and maps can further help assessors narrow the long list of targets into a precise few of those most likely to be evading taxes.

POWERFUL ANALYTICS

The Assessment Connect web portal provides at-a-glance, actionable intelligence. Built-in reporting, sales ratio calculation models, charts, and maps all help make data easy to access and analyze. For example, users can quickly select a neighborhood or region to study, then filter properties by various criteria to identify patterns and unique values.
